About the College

We Indians, from time immemorial, have realized the value of fire and its power to purify. By adopting this symbol, the Kovai Kalaimagal Educational Trust highlights the significance of the Ever Burning Lamp. In accordance with this symbol, the motto acknowledges that there is a wick within each individual which awaits to be kindled and it is our objective to kindle and bring out the abilities and goodness that remain dormant within each individual.

Established in 1996 by the Kovai Kalaimagal Educational Trust and it was granted an **autonomous** status in 2016. KKCAS is a reputable institution with a **25-year past record of outstanding service**. Accredited by NAAC in both first and second cycles with 'A' grade. KKCAS offers a wide array of Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral Degree programmes in various branches of English, Mathematics(CA), Commerce, Commerce (PA), Commerce (CA), Business Administration, International Business, Computer Science, Information Technology, and Computer Applications. A lot of emphasis is given to enhance the creativity, self-confidence, assertiveness, communication skills, leadership qualities and ethical values of the individual. Besides these the college especially focuses on the development of **Knowledge, Skill and Attitude** of the students. Separate hostel facilities are provided for boys and girls. Comfortable bus facilities are available for transport of students from the city.

Infrastructure

Class Room

The institution has spacious and naturally ventilated classrooms along with light and fans. The Class rooms are equipped to meet the conventional teaching tools and furnished comfortably to meet the student's requirements. Each class room has provision for internet connection through Wi–Fi.

Library

All the functions of the office and the library are computerised. The books have been barcoded. A well-stocked library with books on all disciplines and online library resources such as DELNET, INFLIBNET, e-journals are also accessible.

The Library is provided with Wi-Fi facility and constitutes collection of text books, reference books, back volumes, competitive exam books, and periodicals like journals, magazines, newspapers (in Tamil and English) and so on.

Library hours are exclusively earmarked in the regular timetable during which the students can visit the library for referring journals and magazines related to their subjects. They can also prepare notes on latest advancements in the concerned subjects and can submit the same to the heads of various departments for their perusal. As and when the syllabus is modified or restructured, the books required would immediately be purchased and added to the stock. Further, when new publications of books on the specific subjects are available in the market and suggested as good by experts, such books are also added to the stock. On the basis of the research activities by the research scholars new journals and magazines are subscribed depending on the needs.

The Autolib Automation contains the following modules

• Book Entry – Details of newly arrived books like title of the book, author, publisher, date of purchase are entered and an accession number is generated for the book.

• Book Search – Books can be located by title, accession number, author, subtitle, publisher, or subject. Book Issue – Details of issue of books to students, research scholars and staff are recorded. Book Return/renewal - Details of the book returned by students and book renewal is entered based on the request of the students.

• Report Generation – A weekly, a monthly and an annual report can be generated, based on the information requested by the user, for book purchase, stock verification, usage report of students/staff and scholars.

• OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) service is also provided, where the students faculties to know about the collection of books, availability and renewal date by title, author, publisher etc.

Seminar Hall

The college has a spacious seminar hall with 200 seating capacity for organizing guest lectures, seminars and departments events like Quiz, Group discussion, Games etc

Auditorium

The college has a spacious Air conditioned Auditorium with 600 seating capacity for organizing National conference/ Seminars/ symposia, Inter collegiate meet, Cultural programmes and other special events with sophisticated ICT equipment.

Hostel

The college has separate hostels for boys and girls within the campus with a capacity of 450 and 350 respectively. The hostels have Wi-Fi facility and other amenities.

Gym

IQAC

IQAC suggested that while preparing the list of programmes to be organized by various departments for the academic year 2018-2019, the vision, the mission of the college, the industries expectation of the skills to be possessed by the students are to be kept in mind. Accordingly the departments have prepared the list of programmes in such a way that they would develop their soft skills, enhance their knowledge in the concerned area of study and develop positive attitude.

Alumni Association

Alumni Association plays a vital role in the Development of the Institution. The Alumni Association whole heartedly supports the institution in various ways both academically and Non-Academically. In order to foster a warm relationship, the College maintains regular contact with the alumni and former faculty through various email groups, Whats App Group and social networking sites such as Facebook, Instagram, Twitter etc.. Social Media platform is also a powerful link which waves a bridge between the College and Alumni.

The Alumni association meets twice a year, in which the activities relating to the students support services, faculty development and infrastructure development are discussed and suggestions invited. The relevant suggestions are forwarded to the management for implementation. The Alumni who run businesses also help in recruiting our students for their companies and in recommending our students for placements to the other companies known to them. Alumni of our college provided scholarship to a tune of amount Rs.4,48,363 for our students.

The alumni association conducted a competition named "Maadu Alangarithal Potti" on 12.01.2019. Nearly 159 cows participated in that competition and it has created an awareness among the students about the importance of cattles.

Bridge Course

Bridge course is conducted for newly admitted students by the department of English, mathematics, commerce, and computer science for 30 hours to bridge the gap between school and college education. It helps the students to have a smooth transition from school to college.

Academic and Administrative Audit

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) was conducted for all the departments at the end of every academic year in order to maintain the quality of the institution. The AAA committee along with all the academic and administrative activities provide valuable suggestions for further improvements. The IQAC acquires the summary, feedback and submit to the Principal for further enhancement. The main objective of the AAA is to eliminate unnecessary workload, to identify the roles and responsibilities of the faculty members without any conflicts, to access the effectiveness of the system, and also to sustain the quality of the institution based on SWOT (strengths, weaknesses, Opportunities, threats) analysis. Internal and external audit and review processes require a well-structured system, procedure and course of action for assessment, observation, and analyzing institutional activities.

Administrative Training Programme

Computer training is provided to all the support staff. They are encouraged to enhance their qualification joining distance education program. In case they become eligible for appointment to a higher cadre or to a teaching position they are either promoted or absorbed as a lecturer. Three Administrative Training Programmes were conducted for the non-teaching staff.

Seminar and Conference Organized

The departments of Computer Science, Commerce, and Business Administration together organised 13 workshops, 15 guest lectures, 56 seminars, 8 extension activities, and FDPs. 1 member from the department of Business Administration, 2 members from the department of English Literature, 7 members from the department of Computer Applications, 1 member of the department of Computer Science and 6 members of the department of Mathematics served as resource persons. The Institution has organised 6 Professional Development Programmes through IQAC.

On the Research side, 13 scholars are pursuing M.Phil programme and 14 scholars are pursuing Ph.D.

As the Management encourages research among faculty and the students by providing monetary assistance, the faculty members published 22 papers and students published 12 papers in various reputed national and international journals. In addition, by participating in number of seminars and conferences, the faculty members have presented 32 papers and the students presented 72 papers during this academic year.

Placement

Regarding placement of students in various companies, we are proud to declare 28 companies (such as CTS, TCS, IDBI, KGISL, Infosys etc.,) have visited the college so far and 606 offers were received by the students in the interviews conducted on and off campus.

Training

TCS which is one of the leading IT companies chooses our college every year as part of their CSR to provide training in the name of "Affirmative Action Training programme," which is provided completely free of cost for 100 hours to the economically backward and socially downtrodden students of our college. The course was beneficial to 100 students. Similarly, Infosys offers a free 100-hour training programme to students called "Global Business Foundation Skills," which has benefited roughly 150 students.

Finishing School Programme of duration 3 to 4 weeks is conducted for the first and second year students during their summer vacation. The major objective of this programme is to help students understand the numerous talents that they need to develop in order to become employable and be chosen by companies during campus interviews.

Since the college is situated in a rural area, majority of the students who are admitted to various courses belong to the nearby villages and come from low-income families. They lack English communication skills, self-confidence, interpersonal relationships, and math aptitude. To groom them and develop the aforementioned skills, the Finishing School Programme is conducted during summer vacation for mainly the pre - final year students and the first year students. In the Finishing School Programme, HR personnel from Multinational companies, Professional trainers and a few professors who have specialised in certain areas of training the students are

This programme is not compulsory for all the students. Only those who voluntarily come forward to undergo this training foregoing the vacation are admitted. They are trained extensively to improve their communication in English, Interpersonal relationship, Mathematical Aptitude, preparing their resume, fine tuning their personality, effectively facing the interview and active participation in group discussion.

At the end of the Finishing School Programme, the students have undergone a tremendous transformation. The students are able to overcome the barriers that have kept them from taking the stage and speak fluently in English facing the audience without fear or hesitation. As a result, the majority of the students who took part in the programme were chosen by employers during campus interviews.

Results of EAE

In terms of examination results, we are proud to announce that the pass percentage of students across all undergraduate degrees is 95.69%, while it is 100% in postgraduate studies. We also congratulate the faculty members who have put in strenuous efforts to produce cent percent results in various subjects.

Physical Education.

The facilities for outdoor games like Athletics, Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Handball, Throw ball, Kho – Kho, Badminton, Kabaddi. etc., and facilities for

Student Induction Programme (SIP)

Student Induction Programme is organized for newly admitted students of I UG in the beginning of every academic year.

Orientation is provided for the freshers of UG on the Vision and Mission of the institution, the academic environment, and availability of infrastructure, the duties and responsibilities of the students including anti-ragging awareness, discipline, code of conduct, and awareness on the use of the library and laboratory resources.

A session on the examination and assessment system followed by the college is conducted by the Controller of Examinations. The students are grouped and provided with mentors who will take care of their mental and personal issues throughout the course. Campus walk and a visit to local area is arranged to familiarize the campus and its location

Class Committee Meeting

The class committee meeting is conducted at the end of every semester. The meeting will be convened by the Principal, class representatives, selective students from the class to give their perspectives on academic and non-academic issues. The concerned Head of the Department is responsible for preparing and submitting the minutes in the proper format to the Principal. The Principal will take action to address the issues raised by the students.

Additional Coaching

Slow learners:

In order to increase the pass percentage of the students, slow learners are identified and given additional coaching by the concerned faculty. Also the students who could not get through in the examinations are given remedial coaching so as to make them get through in the immediately next examinations.

• The learning level of students is assessed and are categorized as per the marks secured in Continuous Internal Assessment.

• Additional coaching is provided to the students, realizing the academic difficulties in learning the programme.

• Question bank is prepared in each semester where 20 important questions per unit referring to previous years' question papers are given in each paper for students' reference.

• Tutor-ward system is followed that helps the students to overcome difficulties in learning. A tutor advises, encourages and acts as a confidante to the students

Remedial courses

Remedial courses are conducted for the students who fall short of marks in previous EAE to whom additional contact hours and learning materials are provided. A well-organized tutoring system is in place to provide tutorial classes and individualized learning

Advanced Learners

• Advanced Learners are selected according to the academic performance of students in End Assessment Examination.

• Guest lectures, seminars and conferences are regularly organized to expose advanced learners to additional perspectives on topics pertaining to their courses.

- Students are encouraged to participate in intra and intercollegiate competitions.
- Students are encouraged to enroll in NPTEL, SWAYAM and MOOC online courses.

• Training programmes are organized to help students take up various professional examinations like Civil Services, Banking Services, CA(Chartered Accountant), CMA(Cost Accountant), ACS(Company Secretary), Lectureship Eligibility Tests, etc..

- Career-oriented programmes are organized for interested UG and PG students after class hours.
- Teacher-student Collaborative Research Publications and Research Projects are encouraged to promote research aspirations in students.
- Extracurricular Activity is encouraged which includes paper presentations, attending seminars/conferences or Publications in journals.
- Extra Credit Courses are opted by advanced learners to obtain extra credits in their programme.
- Self Study Courses enhance the learning capability of the students through self-learning.

• Online courses are a part of curriculum that paves a way for the students to acquire knowledge and certificate, apart from the academic based learning through online platforms like Swayam, NPTEL, Udemy, Course Era etc.

• Language skills is developed through many activities such as role-play, story-telling, and conversation practice that benefit the students from rural areas to gain confidence and initiate conversation in English.
