IQAC SUMMARY REPORT - 2017 -2018

Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

- IQAC suggested that while preparing the list of programmes to be organised by various departments for the academic year 2017 2018, the vision, the mission of the college, the industries expectation of the skills to be possessed by the students are to be kept in mind. Accordingly the departments have prepared the list of programmes in such a way that they would develop their soft skills, enhance their knowledge in the concerned area of study and develop positive attitude.
- Since the format for the preparation of Self Study Report and the procedure for the assessment and accreditation have been changed by the NAAC, it was suggested that the FDP may be organised to make the teachers aware of the changed procedure and filling up of the format from the preparation of Self Study Report.
- Instead of giving training to the students for developing their communication skills and their mathematical aptitude outside the class hours IQAC suggested that it could be preferable if the above 2 topics are included in the regular working hours, in order to get better results.

MoU's Signed

The college have signed MoU with the companies/Institutions like Sutherland Global Services Private Limited, Infosys BPO Limited, Monste.com, UTL Technologies Limited, Electronics Sector Skills Council of India (ESSCI), The World Community Service Centre(WCSC), STAR Associates, COINDIA, Edex Academy (Nz) Ltd, Aaruthal Foundation ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu to get students trained for companies to use the expertise available in the institution.

Seminars and Conferences Organized

The departments of Computer Science, Commerce, and Business Administration together organised 89 workshops, guest lectures, seminars, extension activities, and FDPs, as well as two symposia, one at the national level and the other at the state level, and a national conference. 5 members of the department of Computer Science, 2 members of the department of Computer Applications, and 1 member of the department of Mathematics served as resource persons at conferences and seminars, 2 members of the department of Computer Science and 1 member of the department of Computer Applications gave guest lecturers at other institutions, 8 members of the

department of Mathematics trained students in aptitude, 6 members of the department of Business Administration provided skill-oriented training to the students and 4 members of the department of English gave training in communication skills to the students.

Faculty of various department have attended 4 Faculty Development Programmes in Various Institution.

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Research Details

On the Research side, 25 scholars are pursuing M.Phil programme and 18 scholars are pursuing Ph.D. programme. The total number of M.Phil Scholars guided by our faculty as on date is 33 and 6 scholars and 5 of our faculty members have submitted their thesis for the award of Ph.D degree.

As the Management encourages research among faculty and the students by providing monetary assistance, the faculty members published 19 papers and the students published 17 papers in various reputed national and international journals. In addition, by participating in number of seminars and conferences, the faculty members have presented totally 21 papers and the students presented 53 papers during this academic year.

Administrative Training Programme

Computer training is provided to all the support staff. They are encouraged to enhance their qualification joining distance education program. In case they become eligible for appointment to a higher cadre or to a teaching position they are either promoted or absorbed as a lecturer.

Result of EAE

As far as the results of the End Semester Examination are concerned we are proud to announce that the overall pass percentage of students of all undergraduate courses put together is 75% and in PG courses it is 100%. The students are able to get 100% results in 99 subjects of UG courses and 48 papers in PG courses. We also congratulate the faculty members who have put in strenuous efforts to produce cent percent results in various subjects.

Bridge Course

Bridge course is conducted for newly admitted students by the department of English, mathematics, commerce, and computer science for 30 hours to bridge the gap between school and college education. It helps the students to have a smooth transition from school to college.

Placement and Training

Regarding placement of students in various companies, we are proud to declare 12 companies (such as Zalaris, TCS, IDBI, KGISL, Infosys etc.,) have visited the college so far and 236 offers were received by the students in the interviews conducted on and off campus. 30 students of UG courses and 6 students of PG courses were selected for appointment on part time basis by the visiting companies. Due to the efforts taken by the EDC of our college 4 students have became entrepreneurs.

TCS which is one of the leading IT companies chooses our college every year as part of their CSR to provide training in the name of "Affirmative Action Training programme," which is provided completely free of cost for 100 hours to the economically backward and socially downtrodden students of our college. The course was beneficial to 90 students. Similarly, Infosys offers a free 100-hour training programme to students called "Global Business Foundation Skills," which has benefited roughly 150 students

Finishing School Programme of duration 3 to 4 weeks is conducted for the first and second year students during their summer vacation. The major objective of this programme is to help students understand the numerous talents that they need to develop in order to become employable and be chosen by companies during campus interviews.

Co curricular Activity

Participation of the students in any one of the activities (Viz) Seminars, Conferences, Workshops and Symposia etc. conducted by other colleges during their courses of study is compulsory for the award of degree and it should be duly certified by the Head of the Department and submitted to the Controller of Examinations with a copy of the certificate of participation.
